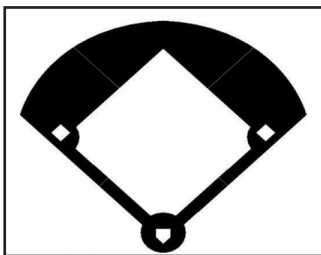

Despite the mixed reviews, the SHPRC remains confident after the success of the their wildly popular phone sex line, which was established earlier this month. (Foucart)

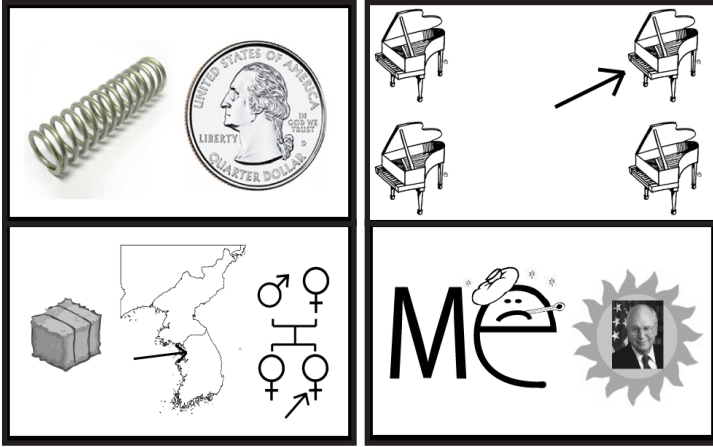

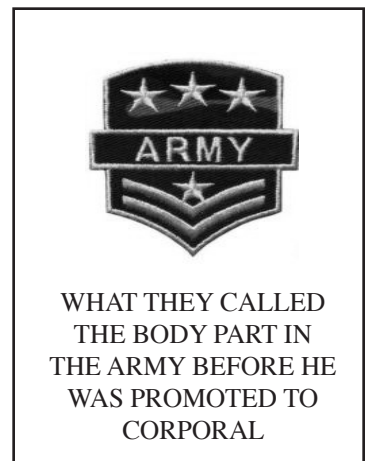
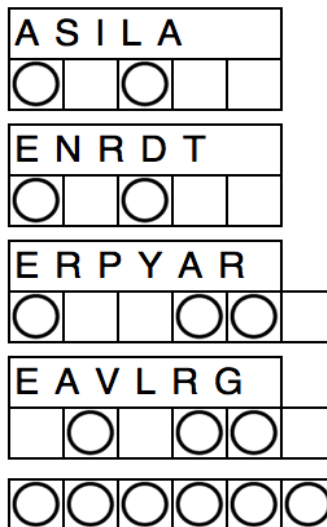
