Following in the footsteps of CS 106A, enrollment in CHINLIT18N: Hints Homosexuality in Daoist Literature has more than doubled since last autumn, according to the latest statistics from the Registrar's Office. The course, which had two students in 2010, currently has five students enrolled with one shopping. Professor Sheila Cheung said that she is thrilled with the dramatically increased interest in her class. "I think this is a sign of greater intellectual trends at Stanford. It seems like Chinese Literature is sexy again." Cheung continued, "With this type of exponential growth, I predict that 72% of Stanford students will be majoring or minoring in Chinese Literature by 2016."

The increased enrollment has introduced a number of logistical challenges. 
